Growth of the Beyond Community



In my letter to parents in November, I explained that the Department for Education (DfE) had recognised the support that the Beyond Schools Trust had provided to the Skills for Life Trust since March 2023. As a result, at the South East Regional Advisory Board meeting on Thursday 16th November 2023, it was decided that both Greenacre Academy and Walderslade Girls' School would become part of the Beyond Schools Trust. Simultaneously, the two Trusts submitted a Merger application for the remaining three Primary schools to join Beyond Schools Trust, which was approved.

As soon as the decision by the DfE was made, work began at pace to prepare for the schools to join our Trust. It has been a very busy few months, and already new structures have been implemented to enable us to have as smooth a transition as possible.

With effect from January, Nicky Archer will take up her post as Director of Secondary Education and will oversee the five Secondary schools. Gavin Evans will oversee the five Primary schools as Director of Primary Education. Both are experienced senior leaders and Ofsted Inspectors, so have the necessary skills and experience to support the changes that are required, whilst still maintaining the Quality of Education delivery across all schools.

This new structure will not only provide increased capacity for school improvement, but also raise the support, where it is needed, at Primary and Secondary level.

I know that change can be challenging, however, our Trust has already proven to be more than capable of supporting and guiding other schools. Therefore, I am incredibly excited to be embarking on the next stage of this merger which I know will enhance the educational provisions for the students in Medway. Please be assured that all stakeholders will be kept updated as and when necessary.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for all your continued support and look forward to welcoming the parents of these schools in my next newsletter.

Buildings Update

Fort Pitt – West Wing

The Trust has been busy with the final stages of the Fort Pitt West Wing Project. We hope to reclaim use of the block, and teachers to take up residence, in the next few weeks. Details and photos of the newly refurbished area will be shared once the project has completed.

Robert Napier – Science Block

The renovations and improvements to the Robert Napier Science block are also underway, and we are in the final stages of selecting a contractor to carry out the works.

We will be replacing the old pre-fabricated block with a new building, which will house science laboratories and provide additional classroom space, further improving the flow of students around the site. Illustrations of what this will look like, will be shared in the next newsletter.

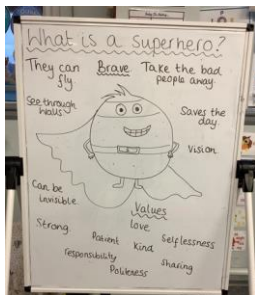

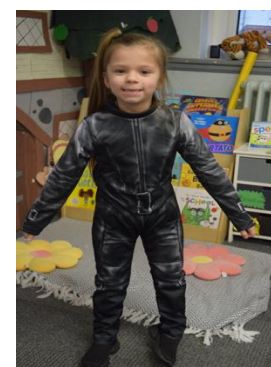
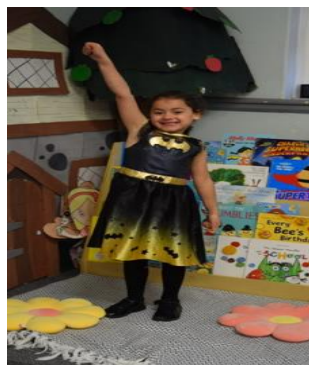

Over the past few terms at Thomas Aveling, the Year 7 students have been busy applying and interviewing to be part of our new Aspire Scholarship Programme.

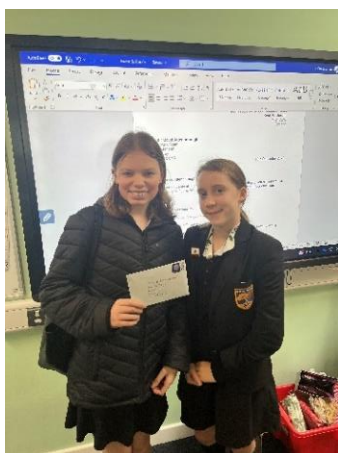
